PURE LAND OF THE PAST & THE FUTURE

If asked the question, “Is the Pure Land a world that you go to after death?” the only way for me to answer that question is, “Yes, it is.” However, the Pure Land is not just a place for the “afterlife.” It is not just the world that I will go to after I die.

If you ask why I take the time to say this (and run the risk of further confusing matters) it is because the Pure Land was established at the same time the Primal Vow of Amida Buddha was established. Because of this, the Pure Land has been pointing us towards a particular direction for 10 kalpa, or an extremely unimaginable long time ago. This “working” of the Pure Land that comes from our past includes all the activity of all those who have gone to the Pure Land before us. It is the activity of those who have helped us, even from the distant past, to hear the Nembutsu. It is also because of this kind of activity that I believe that Shinran Shonin was able to declare, “*Those who meet with the power of the Primal Vow, none will live their lives in vain.*”

Although it goes without saying that there is no present without the past, the present also relies very heavily on the future to exist. If there was no future, for example, there would be no hope in the present. There would be no reason for us to dream about what could be. What is this *hope* or this *dream* that I so casually seem to speak of? The future that the Pure Land speaks to us about is a vision of a world where everyone is able to mutually respect and support each other. It is because it is this kind of world that people are able to help each other without doubt or fear and a world where if there is anyone who is wandering in pain and confusion that everyone of that world will have the ability and skill to save that person.

It is true that the Pure Land speaks of the afterlife. But it would also not make sense if that is all it were. Amida Buddha, for example, is not a Buddha who would wait until our death to share the wisdom and compassion of Enlightenment with us. Instead, the Buddha is a very kind, parent-like figure who is working constantly to try to help us find assurance in our lives in the present. For that purpose, Amida Buddha through *Namo Amida Butsu* is trying to help us to realize that we have already cleared the two most difficult hurdles of what it means to live a rich human life: to appreciate this life that I have already received despite being so difficult to receive, and to appreciate what it means to be hearing the Buddha-Dharma that is difficult to hear.

In coming to realize even these two points we will discover our hearts being moved from a life of the routine to a life of gratitude. The activity from the Pure Land from our past, and the activity from the Pure Land from our future is reaching all of us right now in the present as *Namo Amida Butsu*. In reaching us in this way, the Pure Land is helping us to live a life filled with appreciation and hope.

The tradition extends from mild weather that occurs during the time of equinoxes, though the origin of the holiday dates from **Emperor Shomu** in the 8th century.[1] People who normally worked in the fields had more leisure time to evaluate their own practices, and to make a renewed effort to follow Buddhism. Today, special services are usually observed in Japanese Buddhist temples, and Japanese temples abroad, based on the particular Buddhist tradition or sect.

For over a millennium, Japanese have taken time on these two mild weather days to celebrate Ohigan (彼岸) by evaluating their lives, and renewing their struggle for enlightenment. (from the internet).
